Any registrations received after that date will be placed on a waiting list and will be accepted only if space becomes available.

1. **Philosophy:** RPBL has a long and rich tradition dating back to 1952, and we have grown to become the largest youth baseball league in Baltimore City with over 800 players participating on 60 teams this past season, both boys and girls, ranging in age from 5-15 years old. We are a full-participation “recreation” league where all players participate in every game they attend, and no players are “cut” from our regular league teams.

RPBL’s motto: “Little League – Big Fun” sums up our attitude and approach. The League’s emphasis is on improving skills, making friends, playing together on a team, and above all, having fun. We encourage sportsmanship, camaraderie and respect, and strive to provide a positive and learning experience for all who are a part of the league – players, parents, families, coaches, umpires, and others. 2. **Age Groups:** The Roland Park Baseball Leagues are set up as follows:

- T-Ball League (Ages 5 and 6). Designed as an introduction to baseball.
- International League (Ages 7 and 8). Where coaches pitch to players.
- National League (Ages 9 and 10). Where the players pitch to each other. Bases are set 60 feet apart.
- American League (Ages 11 and 12). Played on a diamond with 70 feet base paths and stealing all but home is allowed.
- Teen League (Ages 13-15). This is the real thing - baseball played on a regulation, 90 foot diamond.

Eligibility is determined by a child's age on May 1, 2019. For example, a player that is age five on May 1, 2019 would be eligible for T-ball; a player that is age ten on May 1, 2019 would be in the National League. Exceptions are sometimes made for special circumstances. Please email all requests to rolandparkbaseball@gmail.com. Thank you.

3. **Roster Requests:** RPBL is one of the few leagues where we allow roster requests for specific teammates, but please know that providing a positive experience for all players and striving for team parity are paramount. Requests for up to two teammates will be considered but cannot be guaranteed, especially at the National, American and Teen Leagues where competitive balance is a major factor. In addition, volunteers for Assistant Coaches are very much appreciated, but the League reserves the right to assign Coaches and Assistant Coaches to teams based on availability and need. Moving just one player around can affect multiple players and teams, so we request your understanding and politeness if a request is not granted.

4. **Travel League:** While RPBL's primary emphasis is on participatory recreation level baseball, we also offer a Travel League program in the 8U, 9-10, 11-12 and 13-15 age groups for those seeking additional baseball at a more competitive level. A player's age is determined by the age that he or she is as of May 1, 2019. That is, a player who turns 13 on May 1, 2019 would be considered 13 for the Spring season; a player who turns 13 on May 2, 2019 would be considered 12 for the Spring season. Players must play for and fully participate with their recreation team in order to play on a RPBL Travel team known as the Roland Park Rangers. Exceptions can be made on a case-by-case basis for those playing full-time on their school team where a player may be "waived out" of RPBL recreation play and still participate on a RPBL Travel team.

Travel teams typically play one or two games on Sunday afternoons during the season, and one weekly practice is usually scheduled on late Saturday afternoons. Attempts are made to avoid conflicts between recreation and travel schedules, but in the event of such conflicts which can occur with rescheduled or rained-out games, the League requires a priority of recreation over travel play.

Travel teams have open try-outs before the season. Travel players are selected through a variety of factors including skill level and potential, commitment and attitude, and ability to fit in with and contribute to the team. Consideration is given to previous participation on a RPBL Travel team, but selection is not guaranteed to players who have played on a travel team previously. The registration fee for 2019 Spring RPBL Travel teams is \$250 per player, which is in addition to the recreation league registration fee. There is no fee to try-out, and the registration fee is only collected after teams are announced. After registration, you will receive notice of the try-out schedule.

5. Schedule: The 2019 RPBL Spring League schedule is as follows:

6. Coaches and Assistant Coaches: RPBL owes its strength not just to its history and traditions, but also to its great cadre of volunteer coaches. We are currently looking for coaches and assistant coaches at all levels. No experience is necessary, but we encourage a positive attitude, patient teaching style, and commitment to providing a great youth sports experience for all involved. 7. **Registration Fees:** 2019 Spring Registration Fees are as follows:

Until February 1: T-Ball: \$100 per player. No sibling discounts apply.
All Other Leagues: \$130 per player. A \$25 discount applies for additional siblings in the same family.

After February 1: T-Ball: \$125 per player. No sibling discounts apply.
All Other Leagues: \$155 per player. A \$25 discount applies for additional siblings in the same family.

8. **“League Endowment” Program:**

Our League strives to provide a RPBL baseball experience to players even if their families cannot afford the registration fees or equipment. The “League Endowment” program offers scholarships to those in need. Application to the “League Endowment” program is confidential and can be accessed by clicking a box on the registration form or by [clicking here](#).

RPBL also seeks contributions to the “League Endowment” program. These contributions are used to support scholarships, defray operating expenses and to finance capital projects. For example, the generosity of RPBL patrons allows us to maintain the fields during the season.

RPBL is a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit organization, and contributions to the fund are tax-deductible to the extent provided by law.

9. **Team Sponsorships:** We currently have 60 teams in 5 different age groups. In addition we participate in several travel team leagues. Every team needs a sponsor to help pay for the uniforms, equipment, field maintenance, umpire fees, and trophies. We need your help in supporting the Roland Park Baseball League’s 2019 season. Every recreational team sponsor will have their name imprinted on their team’s shirts. In addition, your advertisement is printed with a photograph of your team in the RPBL Annual Program. This keepsake is given to all players, families, and sponsors. There are several other exclusive sponsorship opportunities including Field Sponsorship, Field Scoreboard Sponsorship, Outfield Fence Sign Sponsorship, League Designated Sponsorship, Grand Slam Team Sponsorship, Home Run Team Sponsorship, or our Classic Team Sponsorship.
